#### Management Committee Meeting 9 September 2023

#### Meeting Opened at 7.58am

- 1. The Minutes of the August meeting were accepted
- 2. The Inwards Correspondence was accepted, and the Outwards Correspondence was endorsed. It was noted that the WSQ application for registration with the ACNC was approved.
- 3. The Finance Report was presented by Brian Creese and was accepted.
- 4 The Membership Report was presented by Alwyn Clark who noted that Membership stands at 227. Three new Applications for Membership were tabled: Bob Keast, Steve Labruniy and Scott Salisbury and were accepted.
- 5. Three Accident/Incident Reports were tabled, two of which were instances of bowls coming off lathes due to incorrect mounting and holding in a chuck. Photographs will now be taken of all such mistakes to be used as training aides.
- 6. Three Dust Extractors, superfluous to our needs in the downstairs workshop because of the extension of the Micronair system, will be offered for sale by tender for offers over \$350.
- 7. A second Cyclone system will be installed to assist the Micronair system in the downstairs workshop.
- 8. A new chainsaw will be purchased to replace the current one.
- New security procedures will be introduced for the Tool Room: 9.
  - а. The Tool Room will be locked during tea breaks
  - b. The Tool Room will not be opened to members until the Convenor has completed a checking routine at the start of a workshop
- 10. Open Day planning for the 30 September is well underway. Volunteers are required as Demonstrators and to supervise the Come & Try exercise.
- 11. The Bunnings Fathers' Day Family Night was a great PR success. The next Bunnings barbecue is 4 November. Volunteers will be required.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Total income in September (excluding the Open Day) was \$7,319, boosted by receipt of the final instalment (\$2,100) of the grant from the Queensland Department of Environment and Science for the solar battery and panels. Other major sources of income were workshop fees (\$1,262), membership fees (\$1,195), shop sales (\$1,196) and sale of two dust collection units (\$700).

Total expenditure in September was \$4,914. A major cost was the annual premium for our Voluntary Workers Personal Accident insurance (\$1,692). Our quarterly electricity bill was down to \$410 after approximately 6 weeks with the new panels and battery in operation, compared with \$739 the previous guarter; further reduction is anticipated with the new solar system operating for a full quarter and increasing daylight hours. Total expenditure on equipment was \$1,432, including \$1,200 for a new Stihl 45 cm chainsaw. The net financial outcome for September was a profit of \$2,155, giving a small net profit of \$2,453 for year to date.

### **Show and Tell Forum September 2023**

This month the work brought in showed the great variety of skills our members show in their work.

Neil Howard brought a Jacaranda hollow form that had cracked while he was overseas. He very successfully hid the filled crack by carving a spiral pattern the shape of the crack. The surface was left rough off the burl.



Brian Underwood had a lidded box with an offcenter inlay and top. It was done with the disk shown using hot melt glue and the narrow strip slides between the chuck jaws to change center. You do not have to spend big money to do multi center work.



These are two of the panels Rob Mc Greger is making for a fellow member of Bayside. He used a OHP transparency with the flower printed on it to align the woodgrain in the most appropriate direction. The veneer is on the surface of the Huon Pine backing board to give a more 3D effect.



I brought some more animals and a human figure I have been working on which give more variety to my work.



These pieces were brought in by Lucus Watts. The dovetails of the box were cut by hand, a fine effect. The joints in his laminated bowl were trued using a hand plane ... very well done. The natural edge bowl is ironbark from the firewood stack ... well done.

Binang goonj dithy bay – is a phrase from the Bidjara language, Southwest Qld. It means "you hear but don't listen. You're not silly, you're not deaf, you're just not listening!"
