1. The Minutes of the October meeting were presented and accepted.

- 2. The Inwards Correspondence was received, and the Outwards Correspondence endorsed.
- 3. In Business Arising from the Correspondence the Lease Renewal document was discussed with Mike Dunne responsible for clarifying some issues with the BCC and then forwarding the necessary documentation.
- 4. The Finance Report was presented by the Treasurer and accepted.
- 5. The Membership Report was presented by Alwyn Clark noting that there was one new member for the month Aaron Hua.
- 6. In Workplace Health & Safety the Safety Officer, David Williams reported on a Workshop incident of glue failing on a piece of timber attached to a backing board coming off a lathe. Appropriate steps were taken to analyse the cause of the incident and feedback given to the Member.
 - The possible need for a further Evening Open Workshop was discussed and it was resolved that further investigation will take place in the new year.
- 7. Building and Grounds further investigation of the electricity extensions on the downstairs bandsaw and dust extractor has been undertaken and the situation has now been remedied. The Zip Hot water system in the Auditorium continues to have problems and steps will be taken to resolve the problem. A tender has been received and accepted for the old chain saw. Issues continue with the RCD and the Dust Extraction system. Micronair to be contacted and the BCC advised of the continuing issues. A Fire Drill will be organised in the co9ming week by Bob Kennedy.
- 8. Events and Activities Update on the preparations for the November Mt Coot-tha Exhibition was presented. The issue of lack of Member interest in the Zoom of the monthly demonstrations was discussed and it was resolved that this would be discontinued and our subscription cancelled.
- 9. General Business the updating of the Life Members Board was again discussed and photos and information to be finalised as soon as possible.

Treasurer's Report

The Woodturning Exhibition at Mt Coot-tha Botanic Gardens on 24-26 November was very successful. Total sales were \$5,425 on the Friday afternoon, \$9,061 on Saturday and \$6,690 on Sunday, giving a grand total of \$21,176. This figure includes café sales of \$943 and raffle tickets for \$640. Sales from the charity table came to \$219.50, and this amount will be donated to Hummingbird House. Expenses are not yet finalised, but the net profit is expected to be about \$4,500. The club is fortunate in having so many members willing to contribute to the Exhibition, including exhibitors, demonstrators, transport team, café staff and helpers on the sales desk. Many thanks to all these volunteers.

Another major event last month was a Bunnings Sausage Sizzle on Saturday 4 November, where WSQ volunteers cooked and sold 49 kg of sausages and 15 kg of onions, with 34 loaves of bread and 144 drinks. Total sales were \$2,450, and net profit was \$1,774.

Other income for the month included membership fees \$1,010, hall letting \$1,000, workshop fees \$1,207, shop sales \$1,307 and container refunds of \$256. On the expenditure side, we bought a profile cutter head and rip fence for the Felder combination saw for \$763. Other minor expenses totaled \$2,815. With two more Bunnings Sausage Sizzles coming up in December (Tuesday 26 and Sunday 31), we are looking forward to a strong financial finish for 2023.

Demonstration

On the morning of 4 November 2023, a reasonable number of members and friends attended Neil Howard's demonstration titled "What a router can do for woodturning". Spoiler Alert: a router can be used to cut varieties of decorative grooves and holes in a controlled manner. Neil brought a number of turned bowls and platters (see below) he had turned in his workshop to demonstrate how he could embellish the appearance of these items using a trim router.



Neil started by attaching a small trim router to a largish sheet of acrylic. He placed a small bowl face down on a significant plastic bag of paving sand.




He then placed a small straight cutter into the router and removed waste from the bottom of the bowl and shaped 3 chunky feet. The image below shows the technique he wanted to demonstrate. He recommended using a Microplane to get a smooth finish.



Next, Neil attached the router into a timber router mount which he fitted onto a metal tool post. This device was fitted with metal guide rails which allowed the router to move forward and backward in a controlled manner.



The tool post can be fitted to the banjo on the lathe as is shown below. He was able slide the cutter across the rim of the bowl, making a decorative cut. Using the indexing system on the lathe he could repeat this process 24 times.



But, Neil is an ingenious man. He has built an acrylic indexing system that sits between the headstock and the chuck, with a metal brake attached to the lathe bed. This allows him 48 stops, i.e., 48 decorative cuts. This is shown below.



Next, he sanded the rim of the bowl with a power sander to tidy up the cuts.




Below is the demonstration piece. On the left side uses 24 stops, and the right uses 48 stops. There can be no doubt that the 48 stop system provides greater decorative possibilities.



Neil put another bowl with a wide rim on the lathe. Using the 48 stop indexing system, he cut decorative grooves, and them made holes in every groove to further enhance the decorative effect. This is shown below.




Neil next mounted a large bowl with a tall sloping wall on the lathe. He cut grooves into the internal face of the bowl using the 24 stop indexing system.



Then he used a parting tool to cut parallel grooves around the outside face of the bowl as shown below.



The effect he had set out to achieve is shown below. Wow, that is a pretty attractive, decorative bowl.



The members present were very impressed by Neil's demonstration. They gave him well earned round of applause, and then bombarded him with a few hundred questions. Thanks, Neil, for an excellent demonstration.
