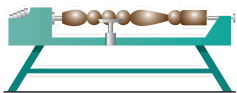

Coordinators role, Frank can support Sheds with resources, activities and events related to men's health and the National Shed Development Program

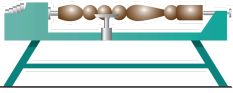
It is planned to meet quarterly. The opportunity to meet with other club presidents and share ideas can open a lot of possibilities.

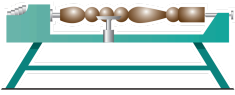
1. **Minutes,** The Minutes as presented were accepted.
2. **Correspondence.** The Correspondence list as presented was accepted.
3. **Finance.** See the Treasurer's Finance Report for details. The Treasurer indicated that she is looking carefully at the various WSQ Insurance policies and will prepare a price comparison with the AMSA policies as recently advised.
4. **Membership.** The Membership Secretary reported that the current Membership stands at 233. The Applications for Membership received from Grant Reid, Iain Audsley and Geoff Osbaldstone were accepted.
5. **Workplace Health & Safety.** Neil Howard reported that the Safety Strip on the front stairs has been replaced, the locks installed on the inside of the roller door in the Auditorium and a lock put on the Fire Extinguisher box. Bob Kennedy reported that there was still some confusion with the documentation required for the Fire Drill process and some further refining of the process is necessary.

Bob Kennedy is organizing the Fire Extinguisher Training for the Convenors. The second Fire Alarm will be installed when it is available.

The Bottle Collection process has been difficult over the last month and certainly needs refining.

The Security Cameras have been recalibrated and are working effectively.

An auto-closing lock is to be attached to the door of the Shop, a bar is to be installed on the roller door and a new lock installed on the door leading from the upstairs workshop into the Auditorium.



The role of the Senior Convenor is to be considered at a future meeting.

6. **Building & Grounds.** Quotes for the Air-Conditioning of the Auditorium were tabled. 3x8kw Mitsubishi units are to be installed.

7. **Tools & Equipment.** The purchase of Tools, as per the list submitted by Harold Wiltshire, was approved. Reg Weber reported on his attempt to source a cheaper maintenance provider for the Micronair. Further clarification of what is offered is necessary.

8. **Events & Activities.** Belmont - the map of the Hall layout was provided, Car Park directional signs were discussed and a map of the Kitchen and Dining area are yet to come. Vests will be required for the Car Parking personnel.

Mike Dunne reported on the meeting of the Metro Division of QMSA.

The meeting was informed of the proposed Children's Hospital project and a report from the meeting on Thursday 20th Feb will be tabled at the next meeting.

Treasurer's Report

The month of January was another profitable one, despite it being a short month, with the Club reopening on 7 January.

The largest contribution to our nett profit of \$2,220 was the Bunnings sausage sizzle on 19 January (\$1,492 profit), together with membership (\$980) and workshop (\$1,190) fees. Our recycled containers added a further \$229 to the coffers. Expenses included acquisition of a bandsaw for the downstairs workshop (traded cost of \$1,330).

Trading results for February will be shared in the next edition, after review and approval by the committee at its next meeting.

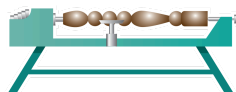
Message for Members selling at WSQ exhibitions

In order to be paid for items sold at our exhibitions, each member must have a three letter identifier (eg. ABC) issued by the Club. This is attached by the member via a sticker, as well as as a price sticker, to each item.

In the past, in addition to identifiers and price, some members have attached a further sticker with an additional number, or letter and number combination. Although this isn't required by the Club it can be a useful way to classify and track exactly what you sell, and a good way to plan for future production.

We've found that at past exhibitions the entry of letter/number combinations for a single item, as well as the required letter identifier and price, slows down the sales process considerably, and is prone to error. This is particularly problematic at busier times at the sales desk where buyers are lined up waiting to pay for your items.



We are asking all members who have previously used a letter/number combination, and are planning to sell at the next Belmont exhibition, to change to a number only classification system. Your personal letter identifier and pricing stickers are obviously still required.

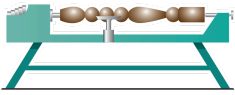
Library Display Report

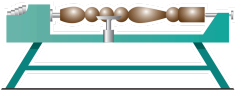
Don't forget to come to the Show and Tell this weekend.

. Theo Haralampou will be demonstrating a 'pot pourri' bowl this coming Saturday 1st March. The demo starts at 9am.

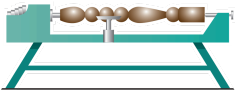
. Saturday is also a Bunnings barbecue at Wecker Rd. It's always good to see Members visit the volunteer workers and taste their cooking!

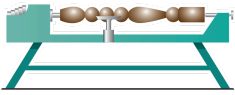

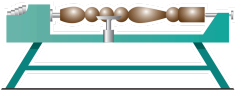
Paul Spruce brought pieces with copper paint on the rim and band.

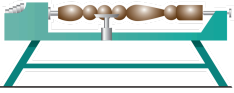

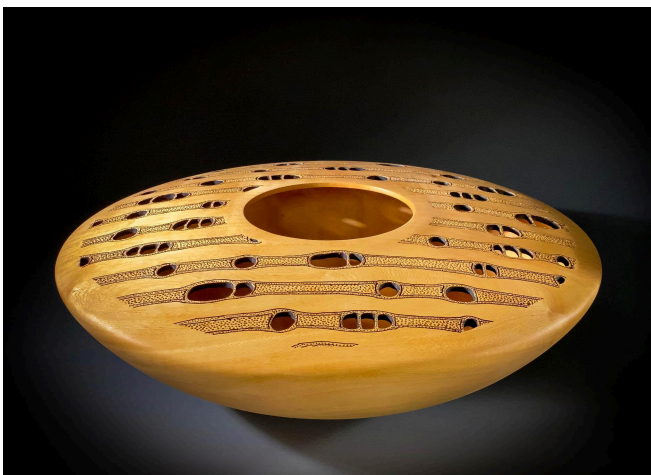
Pierced Rim Bowl, 23.5 cm dia., Jacaranda



Moon, 20 cm dia., 16 cm high, Mango

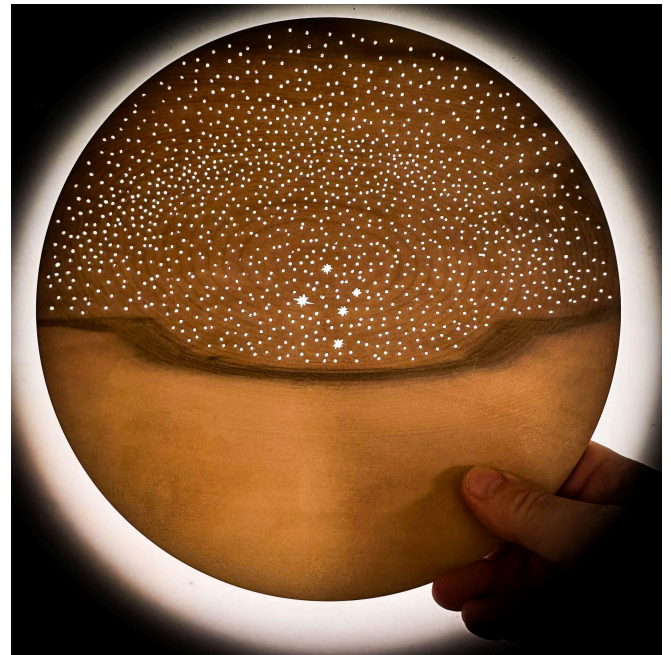


Gidgee Bowl, 9.5 cm dia., 7.5 cm high.

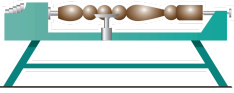

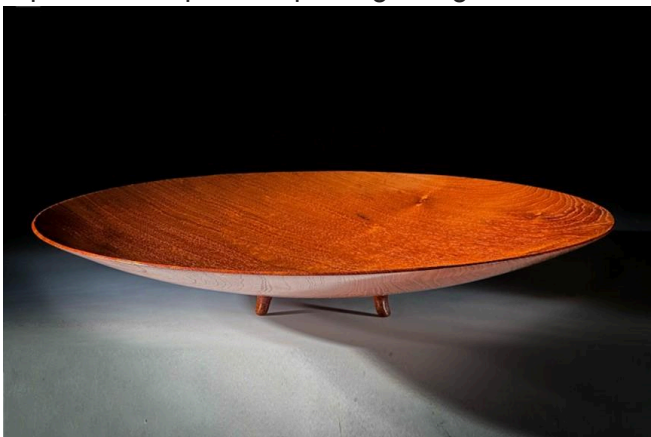
Starry Night, 26 cm dia., 2mm thick, Myrtle



Hill, so *Moon* and *Starry Night* reflect that memory.

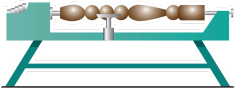

Meet the Maker - Jan Chapman



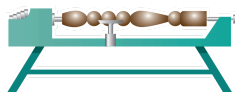

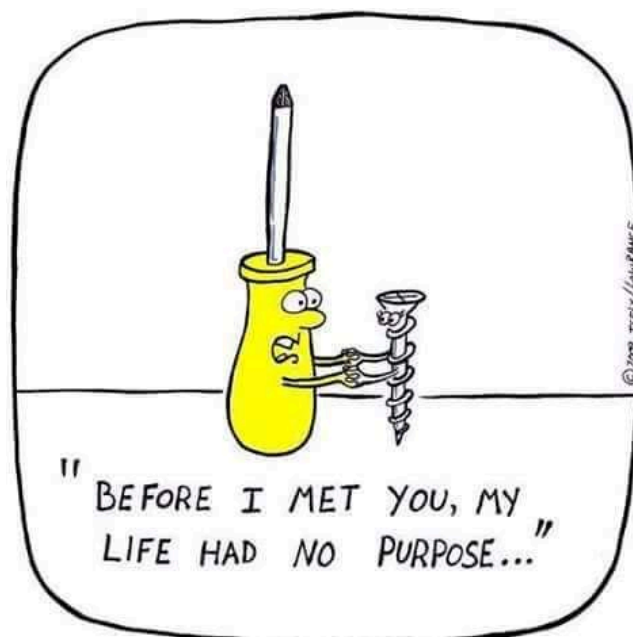
