



At the January management committee meeting the financial reports for December and 2025 were presented.

1. December Report

At the end of December, we had \$27,321 in our two operating accounts, compared to \$36,485 and \$23,152 at the end of November and October. The November figure was high because of the Mt Cootha exhibition Two investment accounts matured and were reinvested. A summary of our current investment accounts is given below:


Major sources of income for December were: November exhibition; Bunnings sausage sizzle; Shop sales; Member training; and Membership fees.

Major expenses for December were Workshop expenses.

1. Minutes

The Minutes, as presented, were accepted.

2. Correspondence

The Correspondence List was presented to the meeting and accepted.

06/02/26 - John Reed's proposal to cancel the Friday afternoon workshop and replace it with a Thursday morning workshop was accepted.

3. Finance

The Finance Report, as presented, was accepted. The Treasurer presented a comparison of Income & Expenditure for 2024 and 2025. The significance of the income derived from the Bunnings BBQs was discussed.

4. Membership

The Membership Report was presented and it is noted that membership now stands at 250.

5. Workplace Health & Safety

There were no Injury/Accident Reports. Visors were replaced on 5 of the WSQ Faceshields, and as this will be the last time that visors will be replaced, Members are to be notified that they will have to provide their own Faceshields in the future. Faceshields must comply with AS/NZS 1337.1. 2010.

The Safety Manuals were reviewed and passed for the 2026 year.

6. Building and Grounds

Mike Dunne hosted a visit from our Bunnings representative and her Manager who offered assistance with confirmed dates for 6 BBQs per year, the provision of paint and assistance with our Food Pantry donations. Neil Howard will render repairs to the Letterbox by replacing the rusted post.

Issues regarding the Containers for Change was discussed with Jan Chapman to investigate an alternative provider.

7. Tools & Equipment

A report from John Carney was tabled and discussed. A new pen-mandrel set will be purchased, 2 new mats for the demonstration lathe in the auditorium will be purchased, the light on the demonstration lathe will be replaced with one with a longer goose-neck and the microphone for the headpiece for the video will be replaced. He reported that the chuck and lathe maintenance in December went well with the Stubby requiring a new drive belt and 3 chucks requiring further attention. All work has been completed in preparation for the 2026 opening. The compressor is about to be serviced. New Woodworking tools have been purchased and will be secured in the downstairs workshop. A Vicmarc lathe, Linisher and Drum Sander will be offered for sale.


8. Events & Activities



Members Only Facebook group






Carving Report

I would like to highlight the work and assistance of two of our wood carving members. Di and Sue are “frequent fliers” in our group.

Sue has produced a portfolio of 3d wood carving patterns for herself and others in the group to use. These patterns have been an outstanding success in introducing members to wood carving. The chosen material is photocopied and glued to a wood block. The outline is then cut on either the bandsaw or scroll saw followed by detailed work with knife and chisel. The final product is a wonderful gift or keepsake.

Examples of such work is shown below. These are a small example of work produced by Di during her time in the group.




The efforts of these two exemplify the sharing and support within our wood carving group. The group appreciates their efforts.




Handheld rotary tool with accessories

Short Story of Ben Guha.

A Memory from Rob McKee

Ben was born in India, moved to Canada after he was married before immigrating to Australia in the 1980's.

He became a student of mine in 2003 as he wanted to learn how to turn wood. Ben attended most of my Woodturning Courses and quickly mastered them all. During this period he also joined the Woodturners Society of Qld as many others did to meet and share his love of the Craft.

Ben was always creative and so keen to learn new skills he soon began to attend Turnfest – Australia's Premier Woodturning Symposium. In 2006 he met and befriended Binh Pho at the Kooralbyn Resort where Turnfest was running that year. Binh was an International Woodturner/Artist that David Drescher had invited to demonstrate his Work; Forms that made him famous. Ben was so excited with Binh's work that he dedicated himself to emulate his work and create forms that used the Techniques and Skills of Binh Pho but with Ben's own twist. The Monarch Butterfly was to become Ben's signature image on his new work and dominated many of his pieces. Binh Pho demonstrated at Turnfest in Australia several times and Ben would always attend to catch up with his friend and learn more skills.

In 2009 Brian McEvoy from Canada was invited to demonstrate at Turnfest at the Radisson Resort on the Gold Coast and once again Ben was excited to meet a fellow Wood Artist like himself. Brian had designed and made a special Hollowing System that made hollowing thin forms easier and less problematic. Ben quickly made his own hollowing Tools created around the ideas Brian had shown us all at Turnfest 2009. A couple of Ben's Hollowing Tools reside in our Tool Store. Many members have been using them without knowing the full story of how and why they were made.


Ben also cooked beautiful Curries and those of us who were lucky enough to share a meal at Ben and Ursula's home can attest to this. Also, he played a mean game of golf. One of his favorite sporting activities.

Ben will be remembered for his friendly smiling face, his bubbly personality, and his creative flair that he just wanted to share with everyone.

Ben passed away from cancer in late 2025. Miss you Ben.
