



Secretary's Report

Management Committee Meeting 14 th February, 2026

Meeting Opened at 7.30am

1. Minutes. The Minutes, as presented, were accepted.

2. Correspondence. The Correspondence List was presented to the meeting and accepted.

3. Finance. The monthly Finance Report, the Annual Financial Statement and the Auditor's Report were presented to the meeting and accepted. It was noted that the Association Liability Insurance is about to fall due at a cost of \$1075. The meeting was advised that the 2026 BCC Better Suburbs Grants had opened and consideration was given to how best to use this grant. The Treasurer is to investigate the purchase of another EFTPOS Terminal that can be made available for Bunnings BBQs and other events.

4. Membership. The Membership Report was presented, noting that Membership now stands at 254.

The Applications for Membership of Sami Succari, Robert Thain, Christine Neal, Ken Bolton and Jenny Kenny were ratified.

5. WH& Injury/Accident Reports as a result of catches were tabled and discussed. In each case the Convenor reinforced to the Member the correct technique for the job at hand. John Reed reported on the need for greater vigilance with the locking of the doors in the downstairs workshop, particularly the door with the security bar to ensure that it is closed properly. John Reed reported that Queensland Ambulance Service will be conducting a CPR training and a limited first aid awareness session for convenors on Wednesday 11 th March at 9.00am.


6. Building and Grounds. The resignation of our Cleaner, Mick Phythian, was tabled. An advertisement advising of the vacancy is to be sent to Members. The issue of keys being made available to new Convenors and new BBQ Captains was discussed and more 'S keys' are to be purchased.

7. Tools & Equipment. The Report from John Carney was tabled noting that a new mat, lighting and microphone has been purchased for the Demonstration area. He further reported that repairs had been carried out to Lathe 15, Forstner bits and a light in the upstairs Workshop. The Sanding Bench was almost complete in the downstairs workshop. He reported on an issue with the Cardiffair and this will need further checking. The restored Vicmarc lathe, donated by a past Member, as well as the Carbatec Drumsander and the Linisher will be advertised for sale.

8. Events & Activities. Some changes to the Rules of the Competition were discussed. A max of 2 entries in any category and a separate category for Lidded Boxes will be introduced, and the number of entries in any category will determine whether 1st and 2nd place will be awarded in the Category. There was a discussion on the issue of advertising for the Belmont Exhibition with enquiries to be made about 2026 costs of roadside signs. The first advice to those on the email register will be mailed mid March with subsequent followup. The issue of timber sales needs to be further clarified.

9. Governance. The document outlining the Roles & Responsibilities of Management Committee Members was adopted. The Succession Planning document listing the roles in WSQ will be sent to all Members. The Honour Boards will be updated with 2025 and 2026 names.

Treasurer's Report

A summary of the key results for January was presented at the February Committee Meeting. At the end of January we had \$30,810 in our two operating accounts, compared to \$27,321 at the end December.

Major sources of income for January were Shop sales; Bunnings sausage sizzle; Workshop fees; Membership fees; and Member training. Major expenses for January were Repairs and maintenance, Supplies and materials, and Member training expenses.

The signed audit report for the annual audit was received from the auditor on 8th February. There were no issues. The Bunnings sausage sizzle on Sunday, February 22 nd , 2026, had sales of \$2,455 and profit of \$1,798.


Pen Turning Course


Home Coming captured his regional history with the pieces generating an emotional connection to the area.

The platter Riverside was a collaboration between Joyce and Terry, with Joyce's detailed pyrography providing the imagery and symbolism.



This exhibition showcased much new wood art inspired by Terry's early years in the Swan Hill region. His return to his roots as an internationally recognised artist was a real delight to the family and friends who attended the exhibition. Many pieces highlighted the natural beauty of timber and his use of imagery of landscape such as the Murray River surprised all. Turned vessels with exquisite texture grain or color provided major features to the works.





Demonstration Report

Dan Woodward - Feet on Bums!



One of the things I've learnt about Woodturners is their absolute inability to walk past a wood turned item and not look at its bum!

I used to think that woodturners were looking for the Turner's name or maybe the wood species. Well, after Dan Woodward's demo I now know it's also an engineering query "How on Earth did they make that?"

The lucky club members who attended on Saturday had a great time at the demo. If you didn't make it in – check out the newsletter dates and add the demos to your calendars already! The demos are the best opportunity to learn, pick up new turning tips & techniques and ask questions from our master woodturners.

Design & Creative Opportunity?

Dan explained that adding feet to a bowl design not only allows the light through by elevating it - it most importantly adds a new level of interest to the overall shape of the bowl.


Dan openly tells us that sometimes when it comes to design his brain is on another planet! (Think back to his demo on walking mushrooms). He topped that idea today with the idea of carved elephants as the feet (think Simon Begg's German ring turning) holding the bowl up – Wow! The possibilities for creative design really are endless!



Feet on Bums - the process!



After putting a block of Rosewood on the lathe (using a faceplate), Dan quickly shaped the outside of the bowl and made a 40mm spigot with dovetail for the chuck. A ring was made for the feet at 100mm-120mm. The material between the feet and spigot was then removed. Dan marked the three feet using the lathe's indexing system –8 notches. The outside of the bowl was then sanded. The faceplate was removed and the bowl was chucked ready for hollowing.



As the woodchips were flying Dan explained that he treats every cut like the last cut – every cut is precision practice. What great advice – and you know there really wasn't much sanding to do on the inside of the bowl at all.




Now for fun part- Power tools!

The bowl was placed in cole jaws allowing Dan to work on shaping the feet. With the lathe turned off, the timber between the marked feet was removed with a 5-inch grinder (although a wood rasp or sabre-tooth Dremel would work too).




The spigot was removed using a sheer scrape and then we were back to (power)sanding to blend the outside of the bowl with the feet. Dan's last tip of the day- bring the tool rest up and just touch the edge of the feet with the chisel. This will ensure the bowl stands true and flat.



Next time you are in the club, take a few minutes to look at the display cabinet and check out Dan's master works. Maybe even tilt your head to the side and look at the many design variations that Dan has made to show off those bowl bums 😊

Thanks Dan, a fantastic demo stretching our imagination into creative bowl design.

Norm Dunkley's passing

I was saddened to hear of Norm Dunkley's recent passing. Norm was one of the early members of the Woodturners Society of Queensland, having joined in 1998. From 2003 to 2005, he was Vice President, and was a tireless worker in creating (along with others) the foundations of our present WSQ. He was one of the original Workshop Supervisors (Convenors).

In those days WSQs main contribution to the Community was the Annual Camp Quality weekend, where a group of woodturners would set up facilities, at a chosen site, (lathes and associated equipment) for a weekend of activities with children suffering from Cancer.


Norm was one of the many who worked tirelessly. From the stories I'm not sure who enjoyed it the most... the children or the turners ?

He also initiated the Tuesday afternoon DVA program with the Keith Payne Unit (KPU) of the Greenslopes Repat Hospital, which ran for many years. Many of us worked with Norm (and later Tom Rowston) on these occasions, with those Vets suffering PTSD. In 2020 he was made an Honorary Member for his ongoing service, support and contribution to our Society.

Norm passed away peacefully, surrounded by family and friends.
